## So now that you've been accepted, what's next?

Now that you have been accepted to Dillard University, make sure that you have submitted the documents listed below:

- FAFSA (Deadline April 1<sup>st</sup>)
- Intent to Enroll Form (Deadline May 1<sup>st</sup>)
- Scholarship Agreement (Deadline (May 1<sup>st</sup>)
- \$150 New Student Enrollment Fee (June 1<sup>st</sup>)
- Immunization Records (August 1<sup>st</sup>)

**Have you taken any college level courses or AP classes while in high school?**

- Submit transcripts for college level courses (including any developmental courses)
- Submit AP score reports

### Course Placement

First time college students are placed into math and English courses based on their ACT/SAT subscores.

- Students with less than an 18 reading subscore on the ACT or less than an 440 critical reading subscore on the SAT will be placed in developmental Critical Analysis and Reasoning.
- Students with less than a 19 English subscore on the ACT or less than an 450 critical reading subscore on the SAT will be placed into Fundamentals of Writing, a developmental course.
- Students with less than a 20 math subscore on the ACT or less than a 480 math subscore on the SAT will be placed into Intermediate Algebra, a developmental course.
- If the student has taken any college level math or English courses and received a C or higher, students must submit official transcripts in order to be placed into the appropriate level of math or english.

### Scholarships

- In order to be ensure that you have been awarded the appropriate level of merit based scholarship, please ensure that the Office of Recruitment, Admissions and Programming has your final high school transcript and all of your ACT/SAT scores no later than August 1<sup>st</sup>.
